### WiFi and Computers

To connect to Yale WiFi:

1. Open your wireless settings and choose the network "YaleGuest."
2. Once your computer has indicated that you are connected to the "YaleGuest" wifi, open a browser and wait for the blue *Yale Terms of Use* page to display.
3. Scroll to the bottom of the page to press the acceptance/ok/continue button.
4. You will now be connected to the Yale Guest wifi signal.
5. You will have to reconnect if you leave the building.

If you have difficulty connecting, please try a different web browser or ask Summer Study staff for assistance.

There are no computer stations available for summer use on campus. You must bring your own laptop or tablet. Library computers are available for research only.

### Printing

Currently there is no open printing option for Summer Study participants. If you have a small, one-off print job, please contact Summer Study staff for assistance.

### Transportation around Yale

Yale provides a free shuttle service around campus. You do not have to show an ID to use the shuttle.

The most walkable area for downtown dining, coffee, and shopping is along the Broadway circle, known as The Shops at Yale: <https://theshopsatyale.com/> You can take the Blue, Orange, or Yellow lines to the corner of York and Elm Streets. You can also ask for directions to the Yale Barns and Noble bookstore at 77 Broadway which is the upper end of the shops. Parking is available in the circle.

Chapel Street from College Street to Howe Street is also walkable with many restaurants, coffee houses, shops and museums. The Blue line and Yellow line will get you to the Yale School of Architecture and Yale University Art Gallery, right in the middle of Chapel Street at the corner of Chapel and York Streets. There is also metered on-street parking.

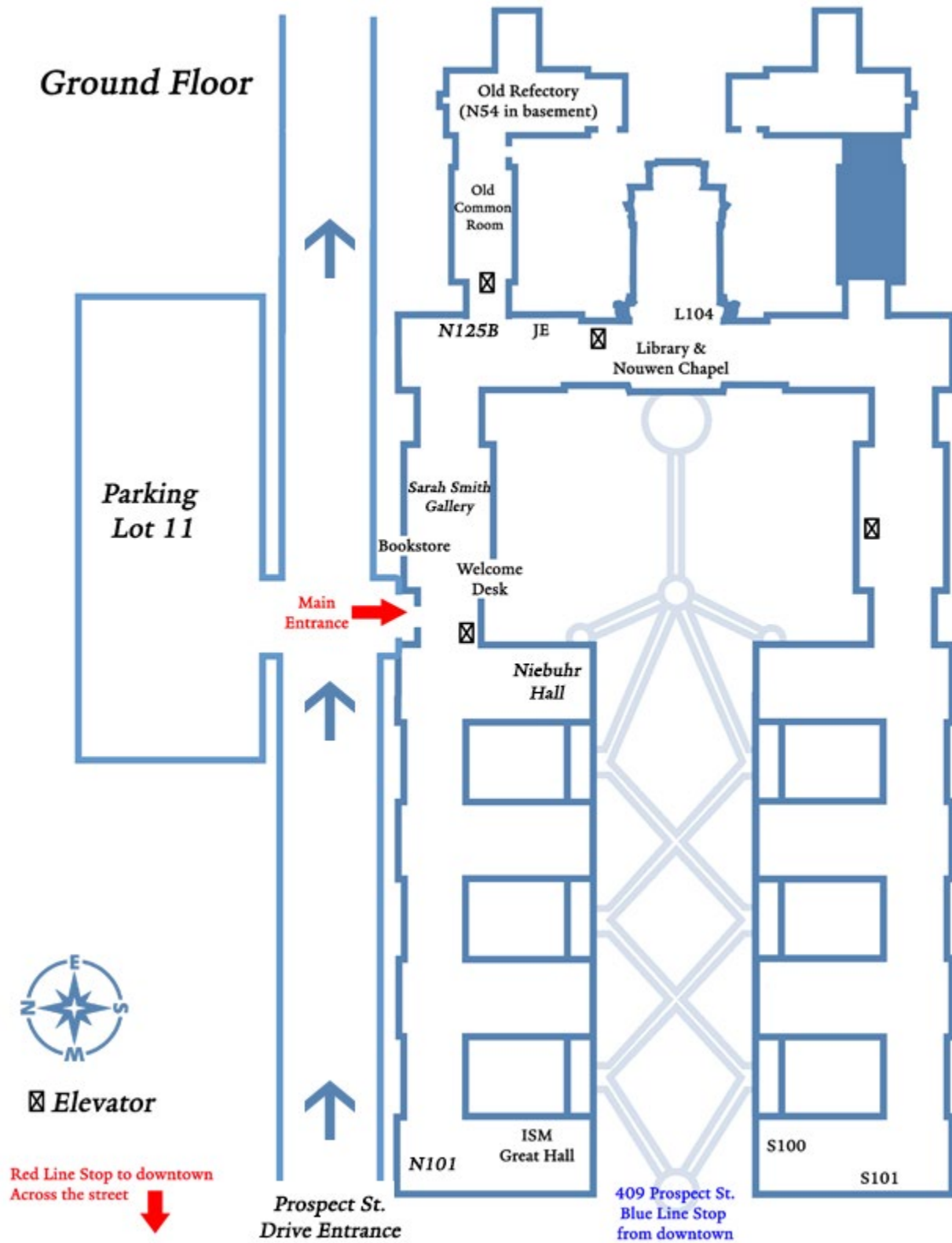
